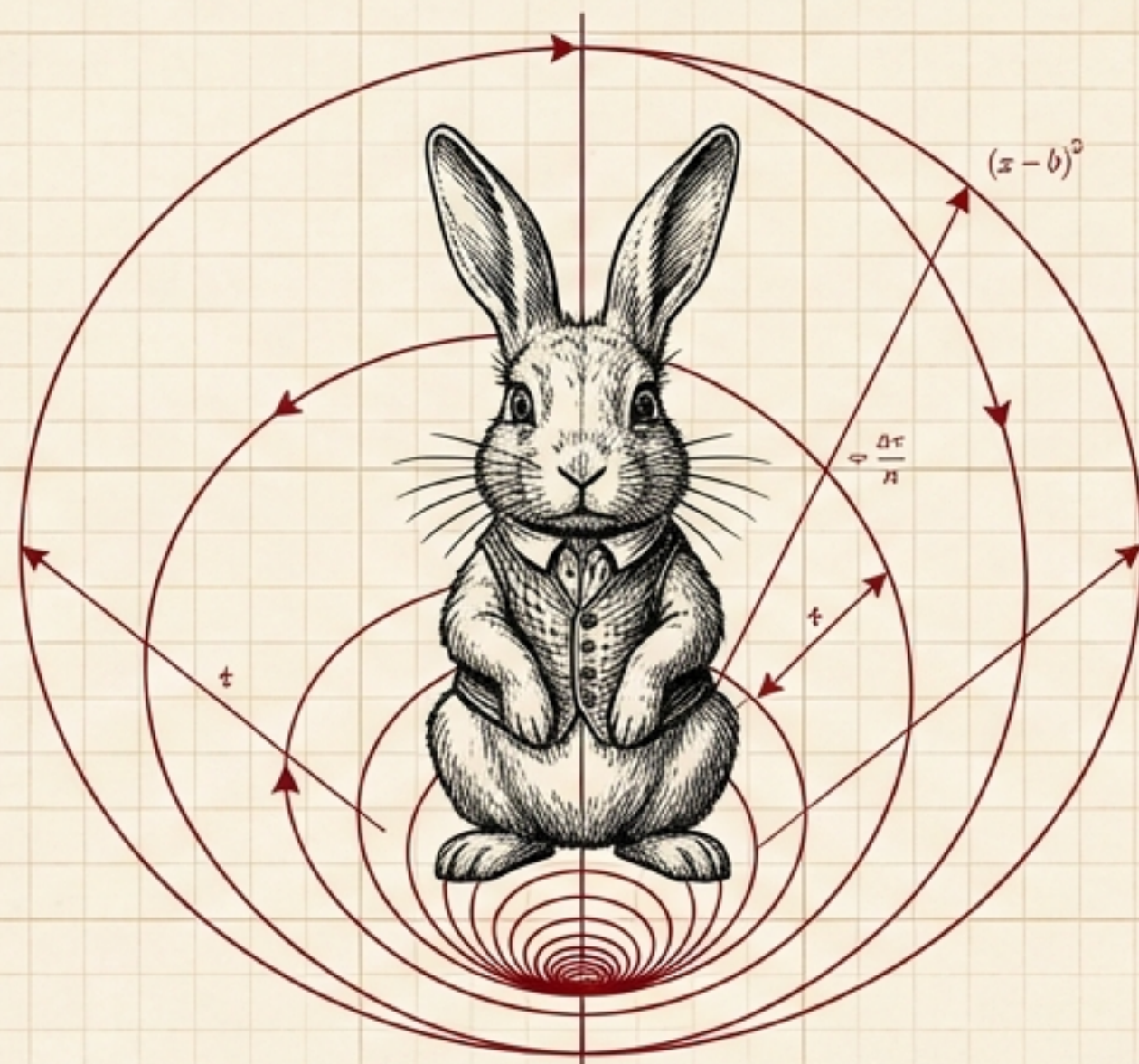

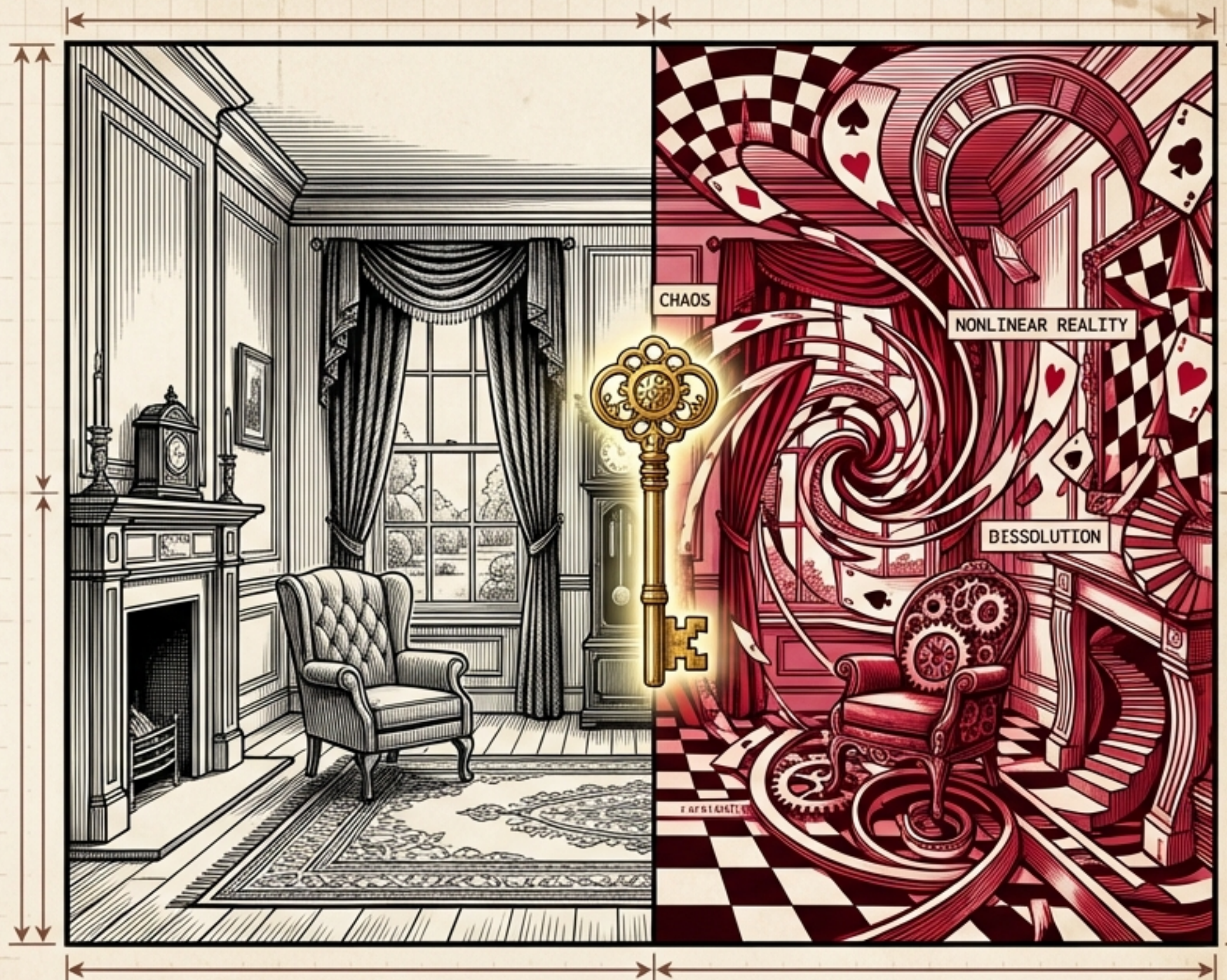

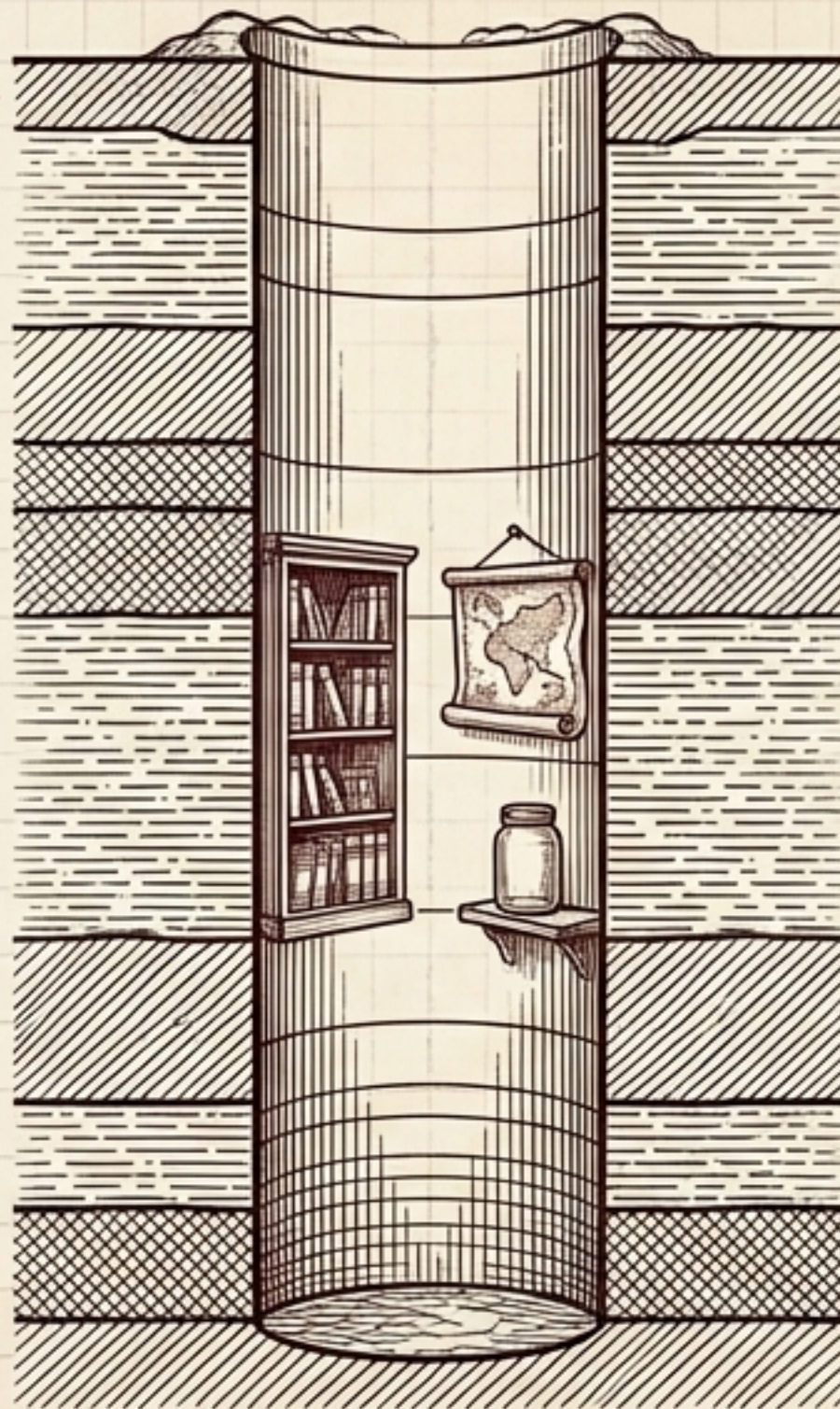

The Catalyst: A disruption of the natural order (a rabbit with a waistcoat and pocket watch).

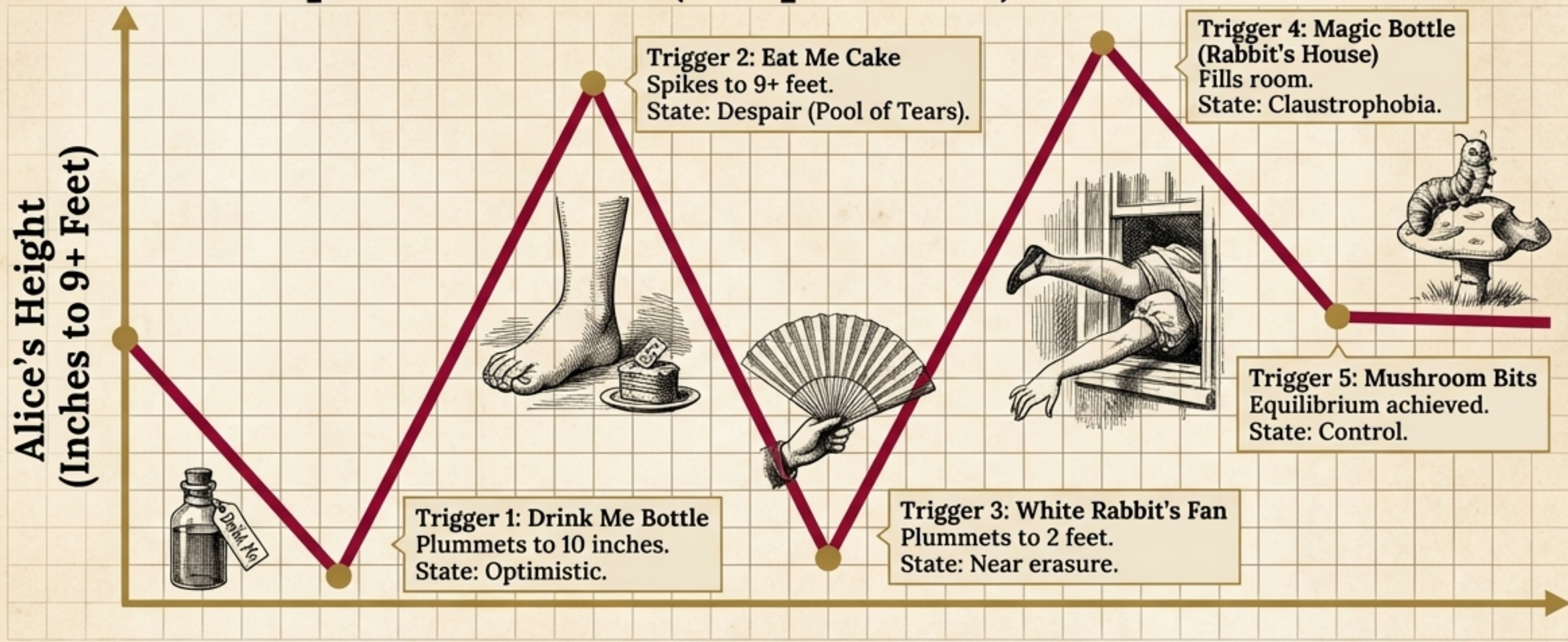


Velocity: Either the well was very deep, or she fell very slowly. (Suspension of physical laws).

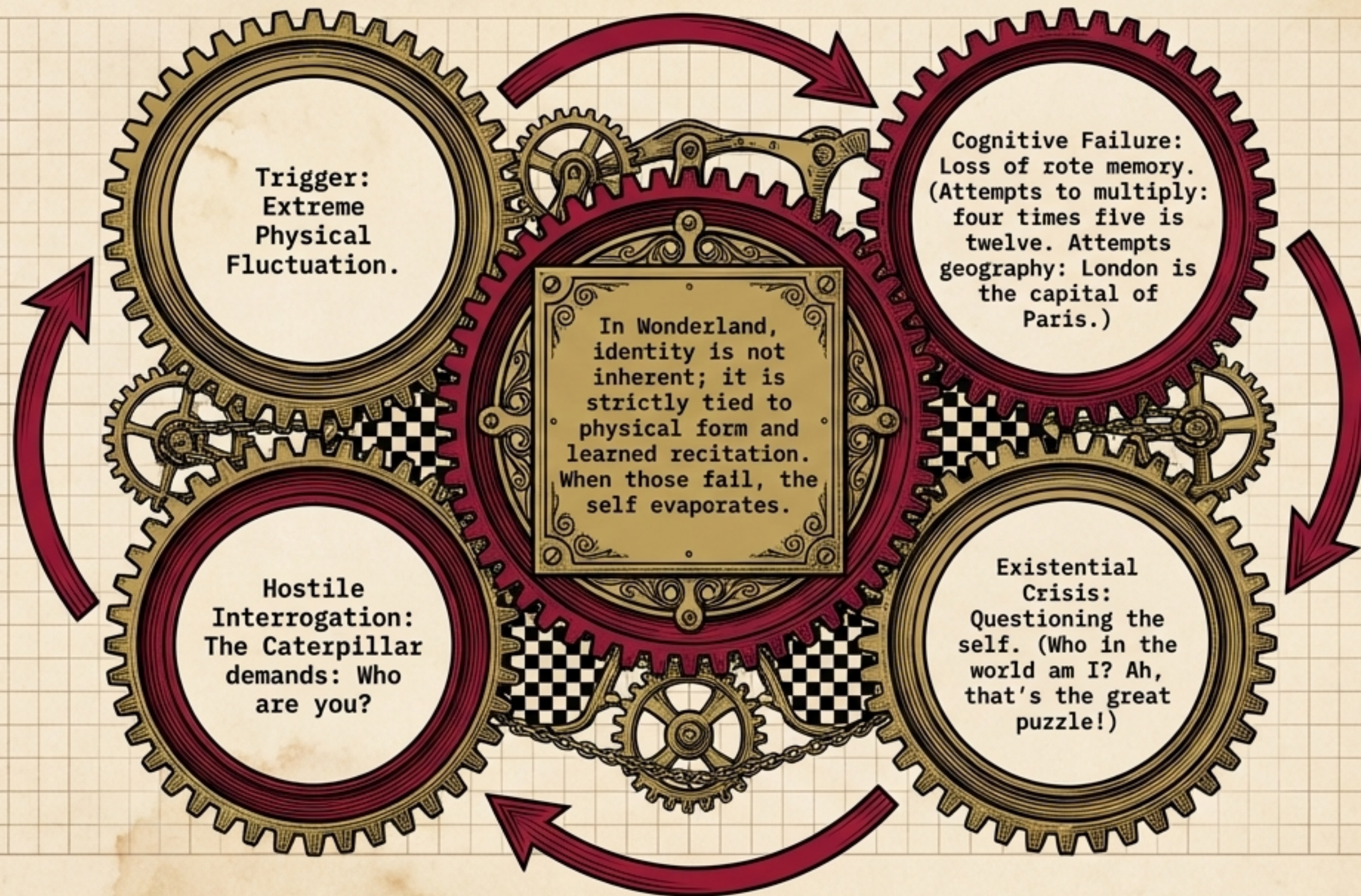

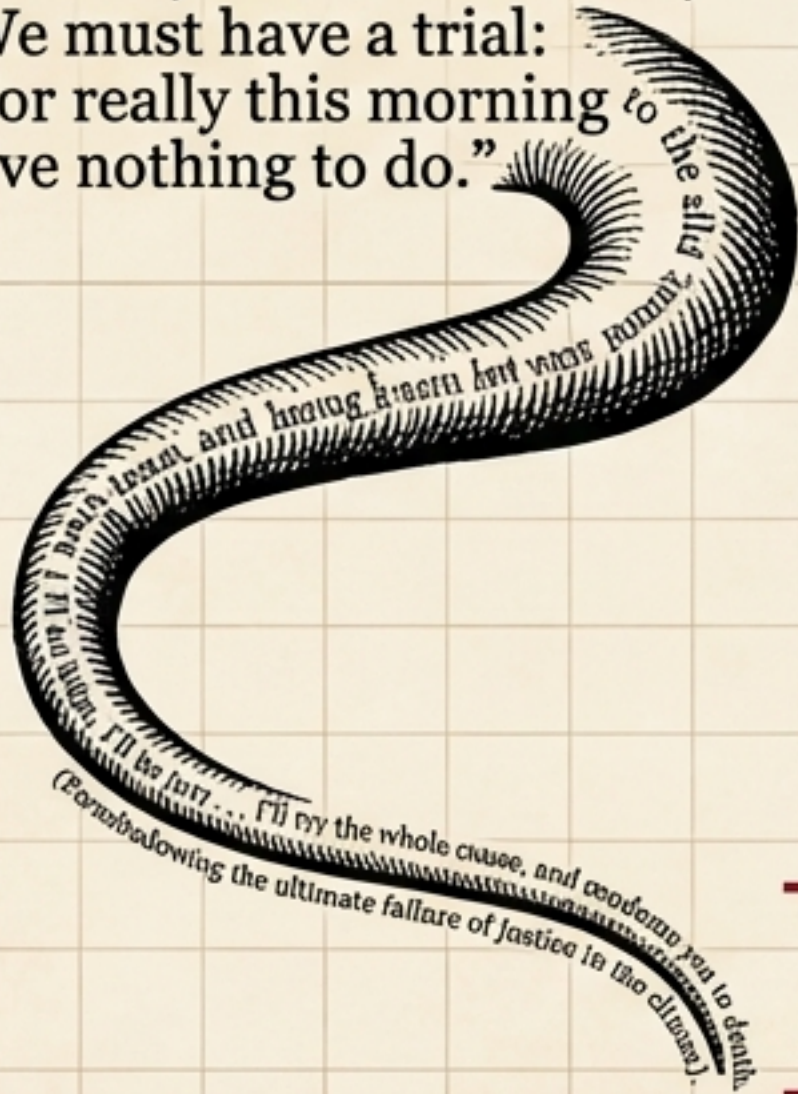

The Mechanics of Disorientation



Form dictates Function: The Concrete Poem

Fury said to a mouse,
That he met in the house,
“Let us both go to law:
I will prosecute you.
—Come, I’ll take no denial;
We must have a trial:
For really this morning
I’ve nothing to do.”



The Pun:

Alice confuses a sad tale with a long tail.

The execution:

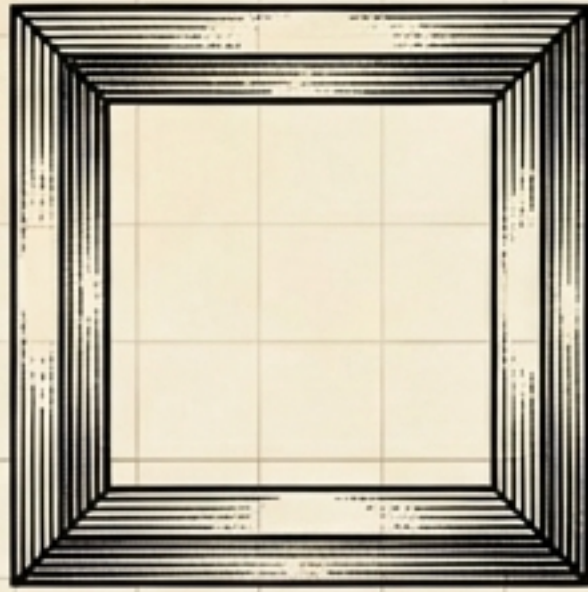
Carroll forces the reader to visually trace the descent of the narrative, matching the physical shape of the animal telling it.

The content:

I’ll be judge, I’ll be jury...
I’ll try the whole cause, and
condemn you to death.
(Foreshowing the ultimate failure
of justice in the climax).

The Syntax of Madness

Alice's Victorian Logic



Relies on objective facts and etiquette.

Example: Believes words have fixed definitions. I call it purring, not growling.

The Cheshire Cat's Syllogism



Premise 1: A dog is not mad. A dog growls when angry and wags its tail when pleased.

Premise 2: I growl (purr) when pleased, and wag my tail when angry.

Conclusion: Therefore, I am mad.

Review Insight

The brilliance of Carroll (a mathematician) is that the grammar and syllogistic structures are perfectly sound. It is only the premises that are absurd. Madness here is highly methodical.

The Mechanics of the Eternal Tea-Party

Central Concept:

Time is not a concept;
He is an entity. The
Hatter quarreled with
Time last March.

The Punishment:

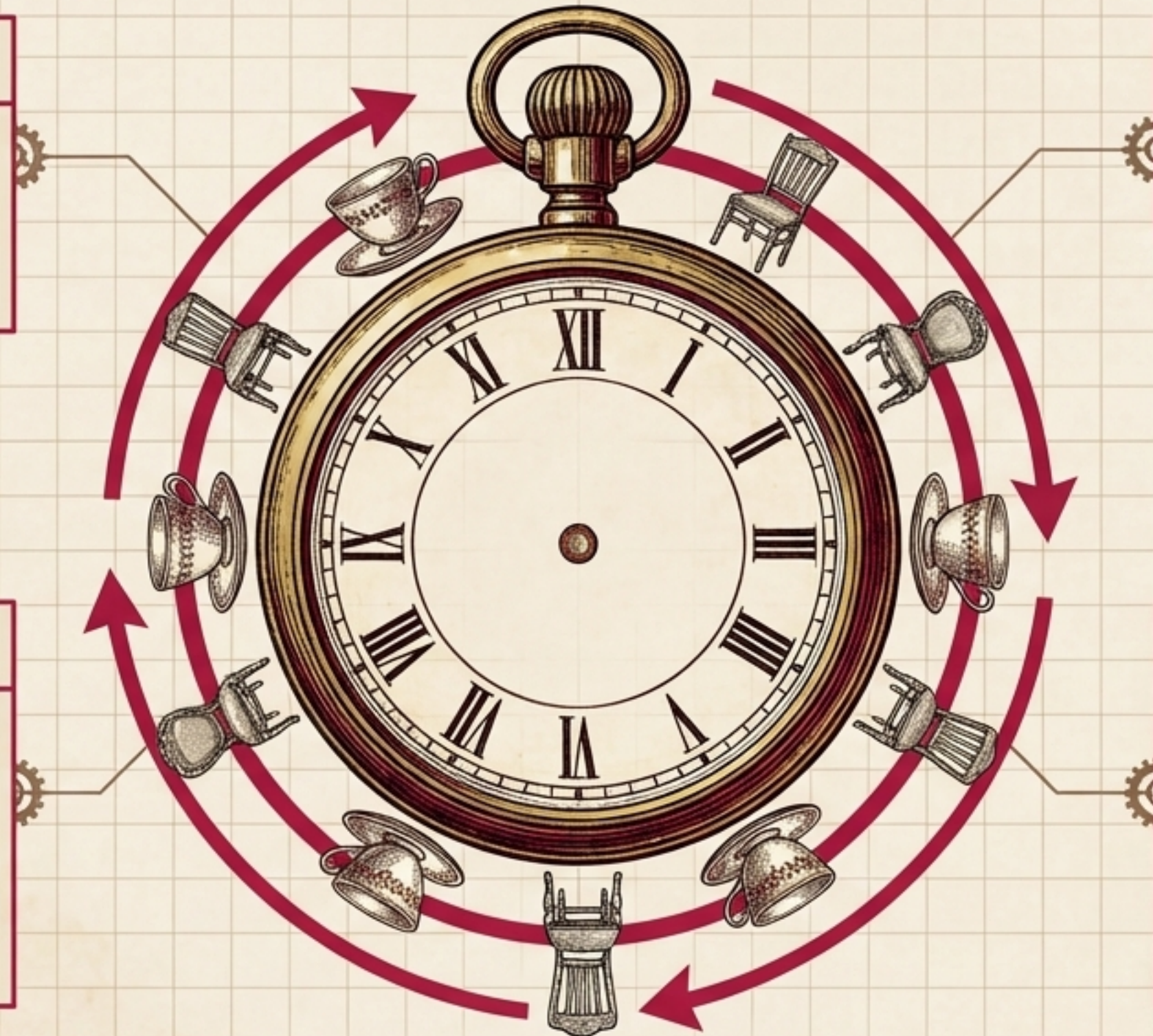
Time froze at exactly
6:00 PM (Tea-time).

The Loophole:

Because time is frozen,
the inhabitants cannot
wash the dishes. They
must continuously rotate
around the table to find
clean settings.

Analytical Takeaway:

Carroll takes a common
linguistic metaphor
(murdering the time)
and enforces it as
literal, inescapable
physics.

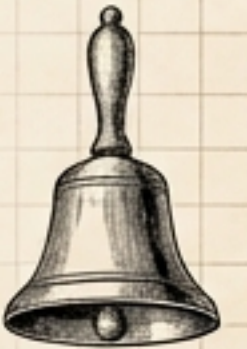

The Failure of Adult Authority

The Duchess (The Moralizer)

Philosophy: Finding meaningless lessons in everything. (Take care of the sense, and the sounds will take care of themselves.)



The Queen of Hearts (The Tyrant)

Method: Absolute fear and capital punishment.



Philosophy: Sentence first—verdict afterwards.



The King of Hearts (The Bureaucrat)

Method: Weak appeasement and false process (pardoning everyone in secret).



Philosophy: Bending logic to fit the desired ruling.

An unsigned letter containing verses with entirely ambiguous pronouns.

The King's Deduction

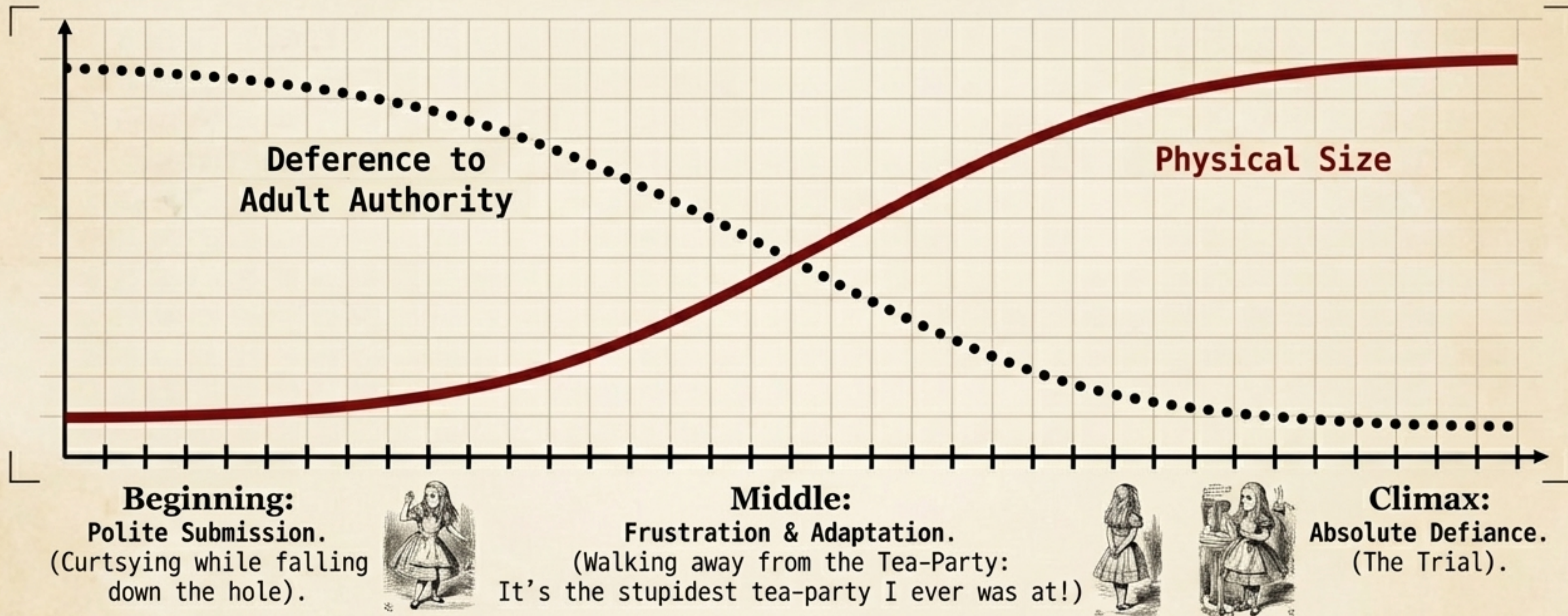
If you didn't sign it, that only makes the matter worse. You must some mischief.

The Verdict

Alice is the only one who recognizes the systemic rot. I don't believe there's an atom of meaning in it.
